Vera Messing is a Senior Research Fellow (Research Professor) with over 15 years' of experience in empirical research on ethnicity, minorities, migration, social exclusion, media representation of vulnerable and/or racialized minority groups and ethnic conflicts as well as social science methodologies. Her work focuses on comparative understanding of different forms and intersections of social inequalities and ethnicity and their consequences. She is specifically interested in policy and civil responses to ethnic diversity in the field of education and labour market. She was part of a number of European collaborative projects since 2008 (FP7 and H2020) in various functions (as research fellow, WP leader and member of the coordinating team). She is also the principal researcher of the European Social Survey in Hungary since 2012. She has indepth and dedicated interest in social science methodologies including qualitative and quantitative methods, and publishes widely on challenges social science methods face in our times.
